## Emergency Medical Fund Helps CHA Save Lives

### EMF Saved These Animals:



**Xavier** – high fever that required hospitalization – Adopted!



**Courtney** – Needed X-rays after problematic delivery of kittens – All Adopted!



**Savannah** – Removal of cancerous tumor – Adopted!



**Avalon** – Dental and hernia surgery – Adopted!



**Elmo** – ACL surgery – Adopted!

A medical emergency is defined as a serious physical condition requiring intervention. When humans encounter a medical emergency, they go to a hospital where they receive professional, but costly, medical attention. Medical emergencies arise for animals, too, and just like humans, our furry friends may need the very costly intervention of veterinary professionals at an animal hospital. The cost of medical attention is usually the responsibility of the animal's owner. But what if there is no owner? What if the medical emergency is experienced by a homeless dog or cat on the doorstep of a shelter? Who takes care of the bill then?

In 2006, CHA established the Emergency Medical Fund (EMF) to cover emergencies or medical services to significantly improve or even save the life of an animal who otherwise would have no hope. This may be treatment of a serious injury or a life-threatening illness.

One example is a beautiful husky named Xavier, who arrived at CHA last March in very bad shape. His discomfort was so severe that he was taken to MedVet, where he was hospitalized. Xavier had an acute condition caused by intestinal parasites. After more than \$1,300 in treatment and hospitalization costs, Xavier was pronounced healthy, put up for adoption and went to his forever home last September.

Medical emergencies are just that – emergencies. When needed, the funds for professional care must already be on hand. Emergencies can't wait while CHA holds a fundraising event to obtain the money needed. This fund is only replenished by the generous donations of caring individuals like you. If the stories of unfortunate animals like Xavier compel you to want to help, consider making a generous donation through our website at CHAAAnimalShelter.org and clicking the "Donations" link. From there, you'll see where you can make donations specifically to the Emergency Medical Fund.

Adopt two cats (over 6 months) for \$70; two kittens (under 6 months) for \$100 or a cat and a kitten for \$85. If you can't take two, then enjoy \$20 off the normal adoption fee and adopt a kitten for \$80 or a cat for \$50.

The reduced adoption fees are supplemented by the Pilkinton Adoption Fund and include spay/neuter, vaccinations and microchipping.

## Long-time Member Joyce Pilkinton Honored

Maine resident Cindi Chapman doesn't know much about CHA Animal Shelter, just that her parents, Joyce and Don Pilkinton, were dedicated to the animals and its cause for many years. Joyce passed away last summer. Here is a portion of Cindi's story about her mother's long-time service to CHA:

*After mom passed, we spent a significant amount of time going through and dividing up photo albums and loose photos. I think my parents had more pictures of their dogs than they did of us kids!*

*I don't remember much about her involvement with CHA, though I knew she loved it. She became terribly hard of hearing, especially with the telephone, and wore hearing aids in both ears. I believe that signaled the end of her working with CHA because most of her help involved phone assistance. A few years ago, she did say that she had hoped to go back someday (she had become much more proficient on the computer by then and thought that perhaps those skills could be put to good use), but soon thereafter my stepdad fell ill and then her health failed.*

*She was an unabashed animal lover. For birthdays and holidays she preferred we donate to CHA (or our own local animal shelters) rather than give her gifts. When she was informed she'd have to go back for another knee replacement, she was more concerned about who would take care of her dogs while she was in the hospital and rehab than the procedure itself.*

*Speaking of dogs, they adopted Dulci, a beagle mix from CHA, and in February 2010, she adopted Koko, a toy poodle from a neighboring shelter. She wanted a very small dog due to her lack of mobility. We even included mention of her dogs in her obituary, as everyone knew how important they were to her. I brought Dulci and Koko home to Maine with me, where I (though not so much my 110 lbs. Great Pyrenees, Luc) love them to death and spoil them rotten in the manner to which they had become accustomed with mom.*

*My mom was a whiz at poem writing. When my dog Ollie died, she wrote the most amazing poem about him that I treasure to this day. When my girlfriend's Springer Spaniel Samantha (a rescue) died, she did the same. I'd provide her with a few key words and she'd compose the remembrance as she sipped her morning coffee. She did this for several of her friends as well when their beloved animals passed away.*

*My mom passed her love for animals onto her kids, as my sister, brother and I have all had shelter and rescue animals over the years. Mom taught us that we all need animals in our lives.*

## President's Message:

### Dear CHA supporters,

Happy New Year to all! I hope this new year finds you and your family – furry and otherwise – as happy and successful as you can be.

At CHA, we're gearing up for 2011, and I am proud to say we are going to have some big shoes to fill when it comes to topping 2010.

Last year, 236 dogs and 349 cats were adopted, a total of 585 animals. This is a 13 percent increase from our 2009 adoption total of 519. While we are incredibly proud of this accomplishment, it hasn't come without a price. Much of our adoption increase is credited to lowering adoption fees, and since we haven't lowered the level of care our animals receive, this has produced a deficit in our adoption income. However, we know these reduced rates are likely an essential way to increase our adoptions, so we need to ensure a long-term means of supporting this trend.

To do so, we are introducing the Pilkinton Adoption Fund, to which donations can be earmarked to subsidize reduced fees. The fund was started with a generous bequest from

long-time member and volunteer Joyce Pilkinton (see story page 2) to allow focus on increasing the number of adoptions without worry of the financial impact of reduced adoption fees. With your contribution to this fund, we can help even more animals find their loving homes in 2011.

### Shelter Director Earns Animal Welfare Certification

CHA Shelter Director Stephanie Wimbish has earned the Certified Animal Welfare Administrator (CAWA) designation, the highest level for animal welfare professionals.

The credential, administered by the Society of Animal Welfare Administrators, distinguishes top-level executives and managers working in nonprofit and municipal agencies for their knowledge, experience and expertise. Only 79 professionals in the U.S., Canada and Australia have achieved this new designation.

CAWA candidates must meet strict eligibility requirements in leadership, management, and animal welfare experience and successfully pass a rigorous exam, developed to meet the highest competency standards. The exam tests knowledge and skills in administration and management, personnel supervision and leadership, public relations and fundraising, animal care and treatment, and reasoning.
